Agricultural Business Management(Con Ed Credit)/AGB 135 Dual Credit Course Syllabus Fall 2011

Course Description: The course is designed for students to earn Parkland credit for the AGB 135 course while fulfilling the State of Illinois Consumer Education requirement for graduation. This will be a fast-paced investigation of the many areas of applied economic principles to the area of managing an agricultural business. We will undertake establishing a cooperative business, monitor the results closely, and hopefully reap the benefits. You will also have the opportunity to interview business leaders in the community about their strategies for success. The course work will be rigorous; however, the experiences and opportunities will challenge you to think in terms of the business and financial world.
